
Your Used Clothing is Our Hero

Mentoring Makes a Difference

A Social Return on Investment study detennined that for every \$1 invested in mentoring programs, \$18 is returned to society. But the benefits of mentoring go beyond the monetary return-Big Brothers Big Sisters programs also improve the mental health, employment opportunities, and civic engagement of at risk children over the long term.

WHAT IS CLOTHES FOR KIDS' SAKE?

In March of 2016, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Ottawa (BBBSO) embarked on a **new fundraising initiative**: collecting donations of clothing through the **placement of donation bins on high**-

traffic properties. BBBSO is paid for the clothing collected (by the pound) which means that funds raised through our clothing collection directly support the youth in our programs. This initiative is based on a well-researched business plan and a proven model across five other Big Brother Big Sister agencies in Canada. It's anticipated to become an important sustainable source of funding for BBBSO's programs as it continues to grow.

Additionally, the clothing donation bin program demonstrates our organization's and partners' **strong sense of social responsibility**. Through the act of collecting and redistributing used clothing, we act to **protect the environment by reducing waste**.

MAINTENANCE

- > BBBSO collects the donations on a continual basis
- Bins are maintained and are never overflowing or drawing away from the appearance of the property or building.
- Maintenance and pick-up is performed by the employees of Big Brothers Big Sisters only.

BBBSO would like to **partner** with stakeholders who can **offer space for a dothing donation bin on their property**. This small gesture will go a long way in supporting youth in the community, as it creates an opportunity for BBBSO to **expand our fundraising initiatives**, and therefore **increase the number of children** we are able to serve on an annual basis.

BBBSO would also greatly appreciate your support in **connecting our agency with other entities** who may be interested in supporting this initiative. We have placed **eight bins across the city** so far and are looking to **strategically place another seven** across the city, near our current donors.
