Today, one in seven Canadian adults currently identify as having a mobility, vision or hearing disability and this number is projected to increase to one in five, or 20%, by 2036. 57% of people with disabilities who do not work believe they could if barriers were removed from the workplace, allowing more than half a million Canadian adults to find meaningful employment and contribute millions of dollars to our GDP. Through the Rick Hansen Foundation Accessibility Certification program (RHFAC) we can learn how to increase meaningful accessibility in the built environment from simple things to more innovative approaches.
